



Day 1: Saturday, May 25

We'll fly to Bristol, England in the morning and then drive to the town of Bath by lunch time.

Day 2: Sunday, May 26

We will depart early morning for the legendary village of **Glastonbury**. Cradled in luscious green hills, it is rich in myth and mystery and leaves you spellbound. Glastonbury claims to be Avalon. Its legends of King Arthur, the Grail, ley lines and paganism envelope this ancient town. Druid priests considered this to be their holy mecca. It is the site of Joseph of Arimathea's church and what is thought to be King Arthur's gravesite. Here we will visit **Glastonbury Abbey**.

Atop a huge hill lies the **Glastonbury Tor**. A place where druid high priests and high priestesses were trained and initiated. Below it, flows the ley line (earth energies) of Mary Magdalene and Archangel Michaël and where some say fairies can be seen.





We will walk to the top of the Tor (optional) – linked to opening our crown chakra. This is a place where Druid high priests and priestesses were trained and initiated.



At the foot of Glastonbury Tor, lies the **Chalice Well**. Some say the Holy Grail is buried inside or nearby. The red water that flows from the well is said to be healing.

Day 3: Monday, May 27

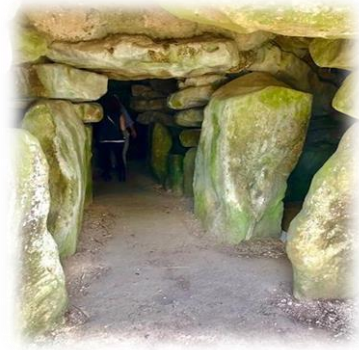

Your morning is free to relax or explore the charming town of Bath -- whether it's shopping or going to places like the Roman Baths, the Bath Abbey, and the Jane Austin Museum. We'll depart in the early afternoon for an exciting day and evening beginning with **Avebury**.



Dating back to 2600 BC, Avebury is older than Stonehenge and is the largest megalithic stone circle in the world. We can freely touch the stones, which is prohibited at Stonehenge.

We'll go **West Kennet Long Barrow**, one of the largest surviving Neolithic chambered long barrows in Britain, built around 3650 BC. It looks very similar to Newgrange in Ireland.



... end our day **INSIDE** the stones of **Stonehenge** for a beautiful sunset. Only 30 people are allowed inside with special permission.

We will return to our hotel about 11 pm. A spectacular ending to the day!

Day 4: Tuesday, May 28

Tintagel hotel

King Arthur/Merlin

We'll depart from our Bath hotel and drive down the **Michael ley line** into the wilds of **Dartmoor**, where we cross bridges over 4000 years old and wander in the magical **Wistman's Faerie Wood**.

We will then dine, as nobles do, at the Hunting Lodge in the middle of the moors. Afterwards we'll climb up the holy **Templar hill** where a church greets us, perched on its peak as if held up only by magic and the energies of the Michael ley line.



Day 5: Wednesday, May 29

We will start the day driving from Bath to the amazing town of Tintagel as the tide reveals one of the most magical places and where it is said Merlin himself worked and initiated druids. We will bravely clamber into '**Merlin's Cave**' where we will do a visualization. As we emerge from the darkness of the cave, we will look up towards **Tintagel Castle**, which is perched on the cliffs above the cave.

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In the afternoon we'll explore the delightful landscape of **Fairies and Gnomes** through the woodland of Rocky Valley, where we will discover the **Bronze Age Labyrinths** next to the river. These are over 3500 years old and are found amongst the ruins of an old mill, said to be built on the grounds of a wise women's college.

Afterward we'll walk into the mystically beautiful **St Nectan's Glen** and waterfall. Here a space is held for the Fairies and the spirit of the 5th century Celtic Christian Saint Nectan. This is said to be the place where the Knights of the Round Table came to be blessed before their quest for the Holy Grail. In the afternoon we will travel back to Bath where we will overnight.
