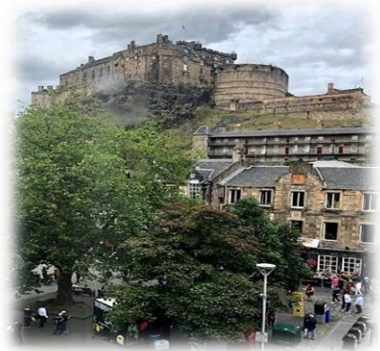

Day 1: Monday, June 2

Apex City Hotel, Edinburgh 1

Please arrive a day early to adjust to the time change and explore Edinburgh Castle, Holyrood Palace, or walk the Royal Mile on your own (or with others who've arrived early). Staying awake and active will help you adjust to any jet lag.

We will meet in the lobby of the Apex City Hotel at 11 am for a Welcome, orientation, lunch and our first group past life regression.



Day 2: Tuesday, June 3

Apex City Hotel Edinburgh 2



We'll begin our day at **Roslin Glen**. It is viewed guardian of rebirth and resurrection, and is an ideal access to your ancestors and the spirit realms.

Roslyn Chapel received international attention after being in the movie "The Da Vinci Code." This uniquely beautiful chapel is connected to the Templars. We'll have dinner in the small town of Roslin before returning to Roslyn Chapel for a **private** evening.



Day 3: Wednesday, June 4

Western Isles Hotel, Isle of Mull 1



Depart Edinburgh to St. Conrad's Kirk. Nestled on the shores of Loch Awe, a marvel of Scottish history, beauty and architectural wonder. Drive to Oban where we'll take an hour long ferry to the Isle of Mull where we will stay for three nights.

Day 4: Thursday, June 5

Western Isles Hotel, Isle of Mull 1



We'll drive through the Isle of Mull to Fionnphort to take a ferry to the Isle of Staffa and Fingal's Cave.

We'll then go to the Isle of Iona, considered Scotland's most sacred site, where we'll explore the Nunnery, Abby, St. Oran's Chapel, and a graveyard with 48 ancient kings.



Day 5: Friday, June 6

Western Isles Hotel, Isle of Mull 1



Patricia will facilitate a group past life regression in the morning. We'll then visit Kilmore Church with a stained glass of Mary Magdalene and Jesus and a stone circle. Free time to explore Tobermory (meaning Mary's Well).

Day 6: Saturday, June 7

Uig Hotel, Isle of Skye 1



We'll depart the Isle of Mull in the morning for our ferry back to Oban and drive through Glencoe on our way to **Eilean Donan** (meaning Island of Donan) Castle. One of the most recognized castles in Scotland, it was settled by Bishop Donan on this tranquil spot to create a monastic cell in 634 AD. The first castle was later established to help protect the area from Viking incursions in the 13th century. We'll then drive to the Isle of Skye and our hotel in Uig where we'll stay for two nights.

Day 7: Sunday, June 8

Uig Hotel, Isle of Skye 2

Today we'll explore:

Fairy Pools - Beautiful rock pools of crystal-clear aqua blue water (on a sunny day) fed by a series of waterfalls. We will walk to the various pools and take in the natural beauty of the land. The pools are magical and the background is majestic. If you didn't see the fairies at the Fairy Glen, perhaps you'll see or feel them here.



Portree: Lunch in this charming little town and time to explore.

The Storr: Legend says that the "old man of Storr" was a giant and is a beacon for spiritual travelers on the Isle of Skye.

The Isle of Skye is absolutely intoxicating with its beautiful unique emerald green mountains located along the coast.



Day 8: Monday, June 9

Caladh Hotel, Stornoway, Isle of Lewis 1



In the morning, we'll explore the **Fairy Glen**, where fairies were believed to live deep within the heather. The belief in fairies goes back to prehistoric times, with a landscape that will captivate you.

We'll take a 2- hour ferry ride to the Isle of Harris before driving to the Isle of Lewis and our hotel.

Day 9: Tuesday, Jun 10

Strathpeffer 1

We'll begin our day early at **The Callanish Stones**. Known as the Stonehenge of the North, the Callanish Stones are an arrangement of standing stones erected in the late Neolithic-era, the main circle erected between 4,500-5,000 years ago.

We'll depart early afternoon for the ferry to the mainland and the Highland hotel in Strathpeffer.



Day 10: Wednesday, June 11

Dakota Hotel (near airport) 1



We'll drive to Urquhart Castle. Once one of Scotland's largest castles, Urquhart saw great conflict during its 500 years as a medieval fortress. Control of the castle passed back and forth between the Scots and English during the Wars of Independence. The power struggles continued, as the Lords of the Isles regularly raided both castle and glen up until the 1500s. The last of the government troops garrisoned here during the Jacobite Risings blew up the castle when they left.

Our last stop will be Clava Cairns, a well-preserved group of burial cairns and standing stones built around 4,000 years ago, and the inspiration for Outlander. Here we'll have our closing ceremony before we travel back to Edinburgh near the airport.



Day 11: Thursday, June 12 Departures
